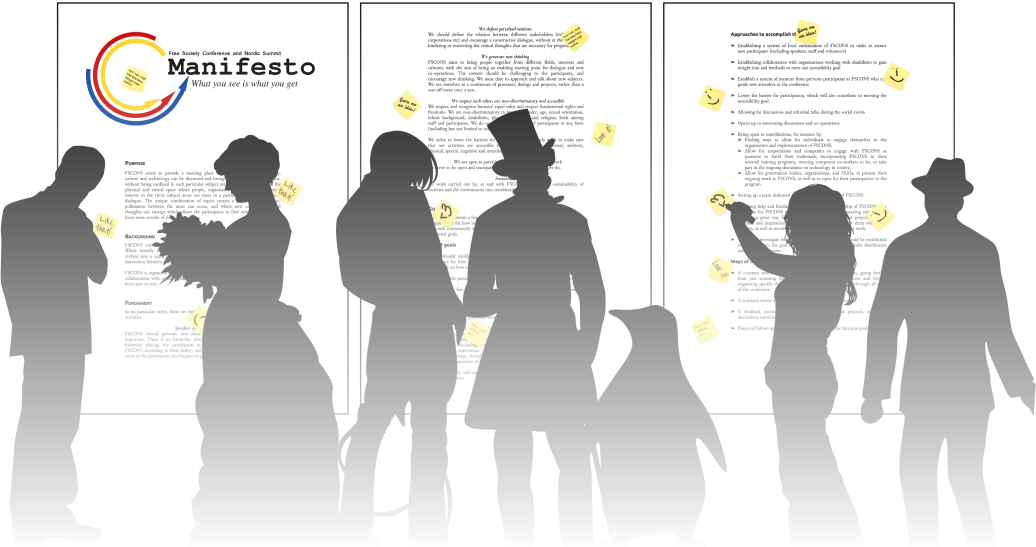


Manifesto

There is a wireless network called NOMAD all over the venue. Your login and password is at the back of your badge.

Where to Eat

Breakfast

When the café opens at 09.15, we'll make juice, coffee, tea and sandwiches (vegan and vegetarian) available gratis in a limited quantity on a first-come first-serve basis. Public Transport



Lindholmen

The closest bus stop to the FSCONS main venue is called Lindholmen. The most useful bus to get to here is number 16. Please note that you can not buy tickets on the bus, but must get them before boarding.

16

Bus 16 gets you to and from the city. It stops at (among other places) Nordstan and Brunnsparken in the city from where you can easily change to other bus or tram lines. There is at least one bus every 30 minutes. Last bus from Lindholmen on Friday and Saturday is at 03.16. The last bus on Sunday is at 00.41.

31

Busses 31 and 99 will get you to and from Hjalmar Brantingsplatsen from where there are connections to other bus and tram lines. These are much less frequent than the 16 bus. Last bus from Lindholmen on Friday, Saturday and Sunday is at 00.19.

Lindholmospiren

There is a ferry going to Lindholmen, stopping at the ferry stop Lindholmospiren, which is just a block from the FSCONS main venue.

There is one ferry per hour (half hour during rush hours) that brings you to and from Rosenlund. The ferry stop Rosenlund is close to Järntorget. The last ferry from Lindholmospiren on Friday and Saturday is at 00.15. Last ferry on Sunday is at 21.15.

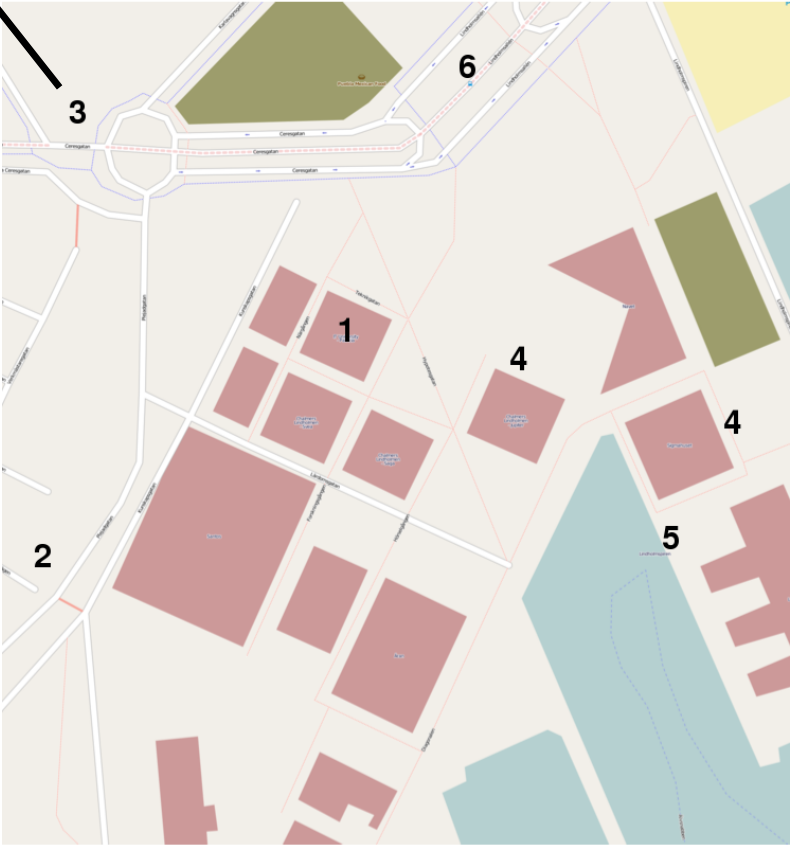

ICA Supermarket

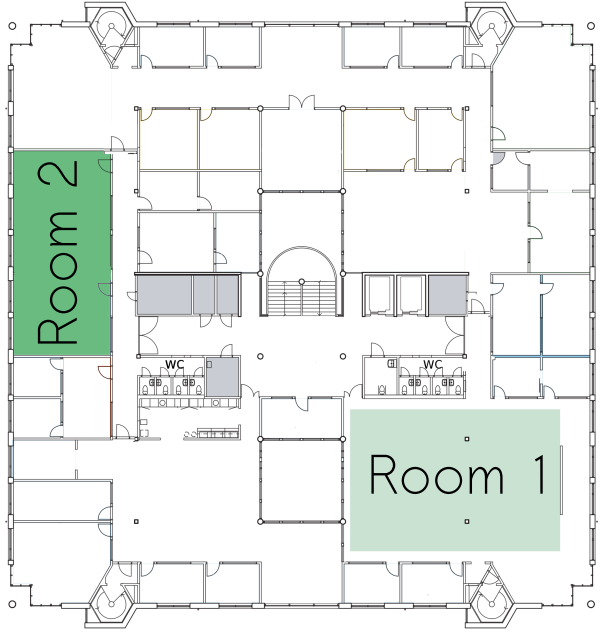


- 1 - FSCONS Venue

- 4 - ATM

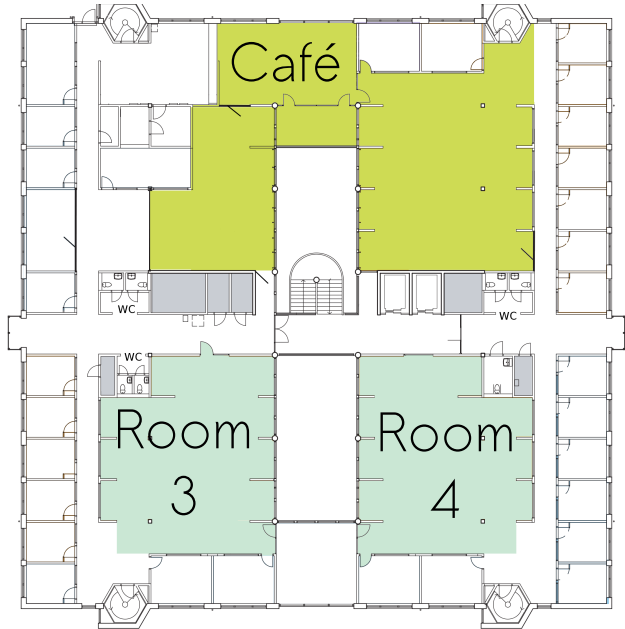
